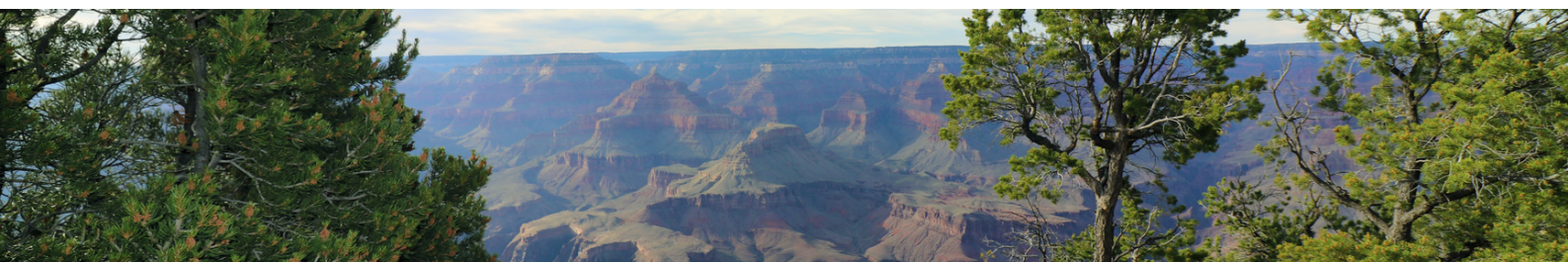
- We are a strong partner to our current members and potential members to **collectively make an impact on the state of Arizona**, leading the charge for our state's environmental, social, and economic change.

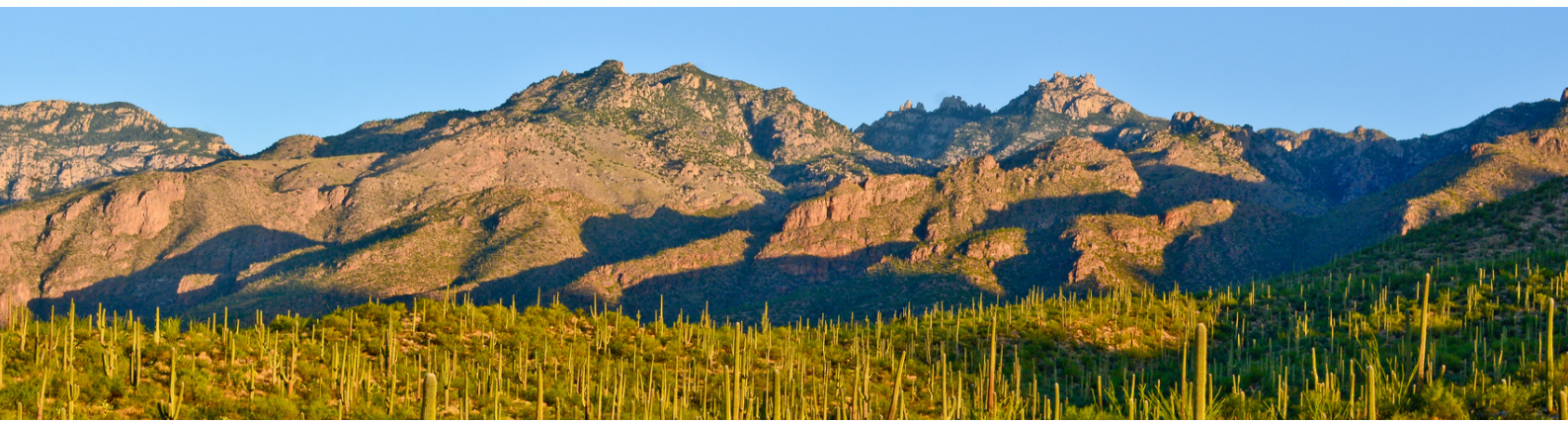
CLIMATE ACTION SUMMIT: THRIVE IN 2035

Arizona Forward hosted a virtual statewide summit focused on how we can act today to ensure Arizona thrives in 2035, with approximately 300 registrants participating in our sessions. Speakers included nationally renowned climate experts, Arizona congressional delegation members, and various experts on energy, water, agriculture, and resiliency.

Significant progress was made on the following goals:

ISSUE COMMITTEES

Arizona Forward engaged about 900 people in the following issue committee meetings:

- **Sustainability Roadmap Committee** - Worked toward articulation of the collective “Long-Term Sustainability Outcomes for the State” through a list of social, economic, and environmental sustainability goals.
- **Mobility & Clean Air Solutions Committee** - Examined issues and opportunities in transportation, for the modernization of Arizona’s transportation methods and infrastructure.
- **Water Strategies Committee** - Convened community-wide discussions, evaluates policies and plans, and builds awareness for sustainable strategies for our state’s most precious resource.
- **Waste & Circular Economy Committee (New!)** - Examined issues and opportunities for exchanging and developing ideas and technologies to reduce and reuse material waste produced in the community.



ENSURING ARIZONA’S GROUNDWATER SUPPLIES

Arizona Forward hosted discussions on the future of groundwater management and how business community leaders play a role in ensuring the long-term security and sustainability of this vital resource.



2021 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

ADVOCATING FOR A MORE SUSTAINABLE ARIZONA

FEDERAL & STATE ADVOCACY

- Engaged with **Senators Sinema and Kelly**, and **Representatives O'Halleran, Kirkpatrick, and Stanton** as we advocated for policies that address climate change
- Championed the appointments of **Deb Haaland as Secretary of the Interior** and **Michael Regan as EPA Administrator**
- Organized state-wide policy roundtables, culminating in an **Infrastructure for Arizona Funding Request Letter** addressed to the **Arizona Congressional Delegation** and signed by four mayors, two chambers, and Arizona Forward
- Testified at the **Mohave County West Basin Water Users Study Committee legislative meeting** in support of sustainable groundwater management

LOCAL ADVOCACY

- Supported transit electrification for the **City of Phoenix and Valley Metro's Battery Electric Bus Initial Investment**
- Helped access federal dollars for the **City of Chandler's Advanced Metering Project**, which monitors water usage and detects water leaks
- Advanced the **City of Flagstaff's METROPLAN**, integrating climate action into Flagstaff's transportation planning systems
- Endorsed the **City of Phoenix's Climate Action**

PHOENIX MURAL PROJECT

Continuing our partnership on Grand Canalscape and our long-standing efforts to promote canal redevelopment, Arizona Forward partnered with the Phoenix Mural project to host a mural festival for the public. 85 artists painted their visions of a more sustainable Arizona along the Grand Canal.

ENVIRONMENTAL EXCELLENCE AWARDS FINALISTS

While the awards gala was postponed, Arizona Forward launched a media campaign highlighting all 80 project finalists. Critical sustainability issues were addressed by all project finalists and will serve as inspiration for us all.

EMERGING SUSTAINABILITY LEADERS

The fourth cohort of Emerging Sustainability Leaders Class commenced in the fall of 2021. This diverse group of 22 outstanding individuals learned to apply new skills to advance sustainability in their organizations and the community. Sessions explored:

- **Sustainability** – history, concepts, and trends
- **Clean Transportation** – smart transportation and autonomous vehicles
- **Water Resources** – securing water for economy, society, and environment
- **Climate Action** – urban/extreme heat, drought, and air quality

- **Healthy Communities & Resiliency** – ensuring human/environmental well-being

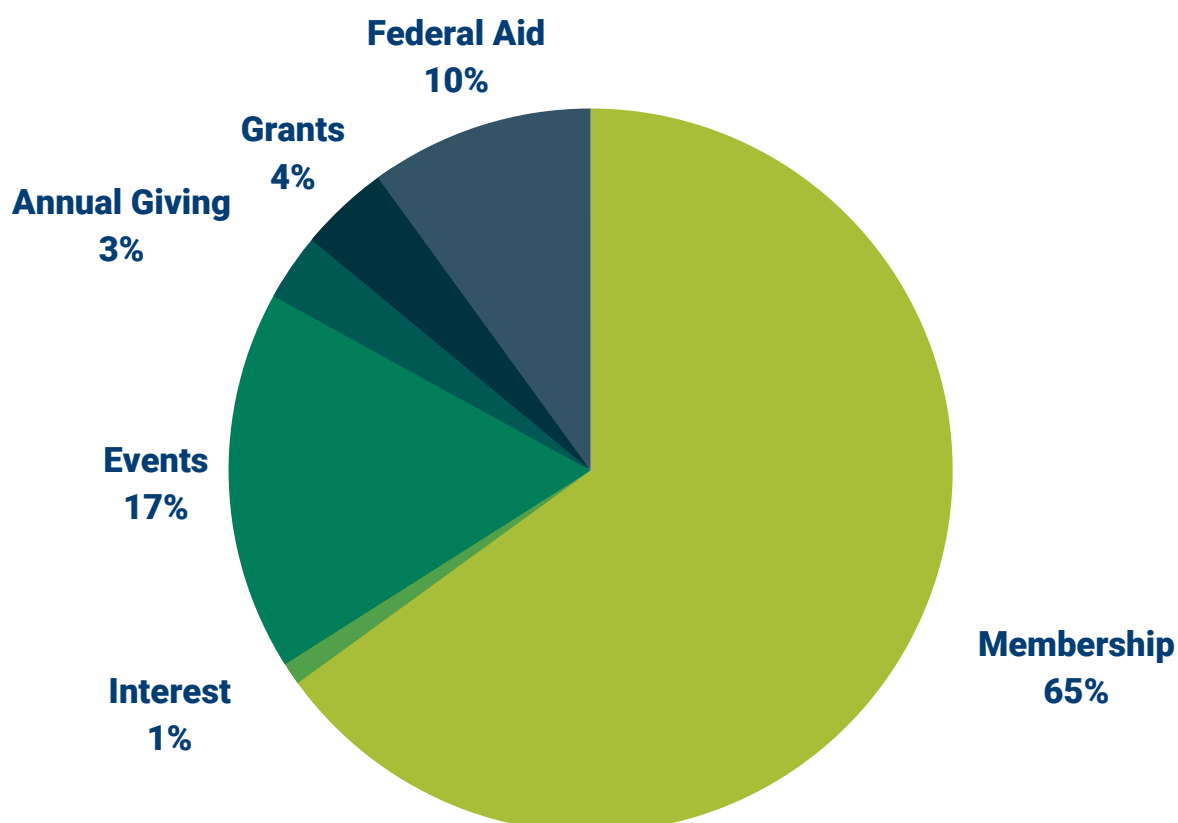
